FOREWORD

Living in a globally connected world means connecting with people whose thinking, reasoning and communication has been shaped by the cultural attributes of their upbringing. Understanding these cultural drivers helps us to communicate more effectively and increases shared understanding. This workshop will explore the fascinating world of cross cultural communication – what it means to understand the cultural dimensions that shape how we think and communicate and how we seek to communicate meaningfully with people from other cultures.

OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, participants will have learned how to:

- Understand their own communication drivers and biases
 - Apply cultural models to better understand dimensions of culture and how this varies across different cultural groups
 - Generate their own cultural profile and compare this with the average for their country and with other countries
 - Develop cultural competence
 - Maintain a healthy curiosity of other cultures leading to greater understanding
 - Use open-ended questions to open up communication across cultural lines
 - Check assumptions and stereotypes people make about other cultural groups
 - Maintain respect for all parties during cross cultural communication
